2019 Hancock County Fair Queen Competition Rules and Regulations

1. Each contestant must be at least 16 years of age and not more than 21 years of age on the first day of the 2019 Iowa State Fair.
2. Contestants must never have been married or have had children.
3. You must reside in Hancock County or the adjoining county if the majority of your activities are in the county you represent.
4. Each contestant must be an active member of at least one service organization in her community such as a church group, Girl Scouts, 4-H, etc. (Eligibility is not limited to 4-H membership.)
5. No professional model (one who has had ongoing employment in which modeling was the primary part of job) is eligible to compete in the count competition.
6. You must arrange your own transportation to and from Des Moines. Accommodations will be made for queen only.
7. You will be judged on
 - Personality, Attitude, Appearance, and Awareness,
 - Leadership and Citizenship, Contribution to Community,
 - Overall Appearance, Charm and Poise
8. The reigning Hancock County Queen is expected to conduct herself in a manner that reflects positively on herself, her family, and county. Should the Hancock County Fair Queen become involved in any activity including a drug, alcohol, or tobacco related charged offense that reflects negatively on herself, her family or Hancock County District Fair, she may be required to forfeit her crown, title and rights of Hancock County District Queen.
